### Legislative News... Janis McCoy, Chair

On January 2, 2024, the Mississippi Legislature convened for their 125-day session. The actions they take will impact each of our lives in some way.

The first week, they primarily dealt with organizational and start-up activities. This was essential since there were newly-elected State officers to be inaugurated, and the logistics of new legislators to be managed (offices, parking, etc.). Now, the work of the legislature has begun in earnest. The number of measures (bills) introduced during the first week to the beginning of the third week has almost quadrupled.

As a Delta Kappa Gamma member, or simply a good citizen, there may bills introduced in which you are interested. What you can do is:

Follow legislation.

Keep up with its progress through the legislative process.

Contact legislators to let them know your view – especially on committee hearings in which they are involved and prior to House votes.

Doing this requires some time and effort on your part, but is not difficult.

One of the websites I have found that provides you with all the information you need is: https://www.legislature.ms.gov/. It's an intuitive website.

To identify measures (bills) that have been introduced you can look under "Legislation." From there you can get the full text of measures (bills), the committee to which a bill has been assigned, and the current status. One way to do this is by selecting "All Measures Not Dead." Another way to get this information is by selecting "Daily Action Reports," but realize that is the activity only for that particular day. Notice: there are very similar listings for both the House of Representatives and the Senate – that is important.

Noting the Committee to which a bill has been assigned is very important because most bills die in committee without "ever seeing the light of day." That means if you are interested in a bill, you need to know who is on the House or Senate committee to which a bill has been assigned and when it will be discussed. By going to "Legislation" and selecting the appropriate legislative committee listing, you can then select the committee to which a bill has been assigned. Then you can go to "Calendars and Schedules" to find when the bill will be dealt with in the committee.

When a bill is in committee, it is extremely important to contact the lawmakers involved. To get information on legislators, select "Legislators." By selecting either "Representative" or "Senator" you will get personal and legislative information (including committee assignments) about that lawmaker. For additional contact information, look under "Roster" – it will have an office phone number and email address for each legislator.

MSO relies on YOU to help the men and women we elect to enact laws we feel are best for our State. Thank you, in advance, for your initiative in doing this!
